DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

I hope all students and families had a happy and safe holiday.

With our return to term, I would like to reinforce our school expectations. Our core values of 'Unity, Knowledge, Respect' continue to apply.

Students are to arrive to school on time. Our school day commences at 8.50am. Punctuality to class is also important.

Attendance, Phones and Uniform

Attendance at school will be closely monitored this term. Students who are ill are expected to stay at home and the absence explained through a note, phone call, email or the Compass app.

Students are reminded that mobile phones are expected to be placed in bags before entering classrooms. They are, more often than not, a distraction to learning, and used inappropriately, are disrespectful to the teacher conducting the lesson. This strongly links to our values of Knowledge and Respect.

Students are expected to be in full school uniform. This expectation is strongly linked to our value of Unity. If unforeseen circumstances occur preventing the wearing of school uniform, students are to provide a note from home and submit it to their check-in teacher. Failure to comply with uniform expectations will result in phone calls, emails and/or detentions.

For me, the most important expectations are that students are respectful and do their best by valuing learning.

Invitation to participate in the first year of a new longitudinal study of young people in Australia.



Our Year 10 students have been invited to participate in the first year of a new longitudinal study of young people in Australia.

In 2022, the GENERATION study will focus on the activities and aspirations of Year 10 students – what they are doing now and what they think they would like to do in the future with study, training and employment.

Each student who completes the survey will receive an individual summary of their career interests, while the school will receive a summary report of the plans of Year 10 students as a group. *No individual student will be identified in the school report*.

There are plans for another ten years of surveys in this longitudinal study. Students will be asked if they are interested in participating in later years of the study. If students agree to participate in later years, they will be asked to provide their contact details. Please note that students are not required to participate in later years, and all questions in the survey are voluntary.
