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

Communication is the Key



3 nominations required - students in Years 11-12

Teachers have submitted their nominations and our office staff are busy organising the certificates and ceremony. The presentation will be held on Thursday, November 10, commencing at 12 noon. Recipients will have received their invitations by email.

Attendance

Attendance continues to be an important aspect of a student's education. Put quite simply, they can't learn if they are not here. **Some friendly reminders:**

Students are expected to attend every day the school is open unless sick or on approved leave

Absences must be explained within 7 days (note, phone call, email or Compass app)

Absences for 2 weeks or more (for example, a holiday) requires a written exemption from the Principal.

Our Relieving Principal, Mrs James, has organised a team to improve our overall attendance patterns across the school with strategies recommended by the Department of Education.

With the dedicated work of our Head Teacher Careers, Ms Cutting, an inaugural competition was devised and our school grabbed the opportunity to demonstrate the futurist thinking and problem solving skills of our students. We had no difficulties in identifying Ivanna, Zoe and Chelsea.



Although they did not get first place in the competition, the feedback from the judges was very positive, with our team being told that they had 'nailed' the marketing, work culture and values aspects of the criteria.

From my point of view, they really showed solid research into the extent of homelessness on the Coast and an extraordinary understanding of how a solution could be found that was both cost effective and be implemented with dignity for those who are struggling.


