DEPUTY **PRINCIPAL'S** REPORT

Regular attendance at

school is obviously important for students to maximise their

learning. Following is a quick reference

guide of our attendance procedures:

Teachers mark junior rolls during check-in by 9.05am (P1 teachers on Wednesdays) and every lesson thereafter.

Senior students are signed in with their first timetabled class.

Late arrivals are to sign in at the Front Office.

Seniors students who leave early due to having no further lessons are to sign out at the Front Office.

Office staff amend attendance on Compass after communication from parents/carers.

Unexplained whole school day absences are emailed to parents/carers later in the school day.

Before any leave passes can be issued the school must receive the request from a parent/carer via a written note, phone call, email or Compass entry.

Students who represent the school at sport, attend excursions, participate in incursions or undertake work placement are recorded as 'School Business.' These activities are not recorded as absences.

Parents can inform the school of absences and lateness via a written note, phone call, email or Compass entry. A valid explanation is required. On occasions of extended illness, a Medical Certificate will be required.

Expected absences of 10 school days or more (e.g. *a holiday*), require an exemption to be applied for. Application forms are available from the Front Office.

Year Advisors and the Deputy Principal monitor attendance rates of individual students. Contact is made home through letters and/or phone calls when absences are causing concern.

Referral to the Home School Liaison Officer is made for students whose absences continue to cause concern.

Students with excellent attendance recognised by the Principal at year's end.

If you have any questions regarding these procedures please feel free to contact me.

From next semester, student reports will have absences reported. The number of days of explained and unexplained will be recorded. In light of this, parents and carers are further encouraged to have student absences explained as outlined above.

Say No to Vaping

Are you concerned about the impact mental health has on the young people in your life? Would you like to learn simple ways to respond to them during times of distress?

EquiEnergy Youth is a charity dedicated to reducing psychological distress, self-harm and the risk of suicide in young people. Our programs aim to connect young people with safe & effective adults with the capacity to effectively respond to them during times of distress and improve mental health outcomes.

As a result of a PhD research project and thousands of hours of clinical experience, Dr Stephen Spencer has developed a simple method to guide adults on how and when to respond to young people in distress to achieve a positive outcome. Steve will coach you on the following;

- A 5 step evidence-based psychological first aid framework (TAR3) for you to follow when responding 'in the moment' to episodes of distress and behavioural challenges. For example, TAR3 is the equivalent of the DR ABC process for responding to first aid.
- Guidance on simple ways you can help young people build coping, resilience and positive help seeking behaviour and the vital role you play in promoting this.
- Context on why child & adolescent mental health occurs and what you can do to improve mental health outcomes for the young people you support.
- Coaching in the use of scripts and engagements strategies to adopt when responding to distress using the TAR3 Psychological First Aid Method.
