

YEAR 12 2024 TRANSITION

Year 8 Mock Interviews

On Thursday 12th October, Year 8 finalised the Mock Interview component of the 'School to Work' program held here at KMHS.

All students were interviewed by a panel of delegates, currently employed in the industry, to give students an authentic experience that matches the 'real world'.



The students prepared a *portfolio*, which included cover letter, résumé and supporting documentation that showcased each individual student's transferable skills and achievements.

Students chose which position to apply for (from four entry level and age appropriate jobs for a Year 8 student). They had to demonstrate they could fulfil the criteria for that job and dress appropriately for the interview. Feedback received from the interviewers was very positive and this was able to showcase to our local community the school's dedication and ability to upskill our students to be resilient, flexible and be prepared for an ever-changing world of work. *Congratulations students, you did yourselves and the school proud!!*
