POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING AWARDS CEREMONY

Recognising student achievement is an integral part of our school's high expectations and success.

In 2024, our school has introduced a behaviour framework in line with the new school plan – Positive Behaviour for Learning. As a result, the STARS assembly has now been replaced by a new award ceremony to reflect this change.

PBL Award recipient eligibility is based on:

- * Accumulation of positive entries on COMPASS.
- * Students adhering to the school's values of Unity, Knowledge and Respect.
- ★ Positive attendance patterns.

The school's PBL team monitor *Compass* entries, using the set criteria to determine students' entry level as *bronze*, *silver* or *gold*.

The *PBL Awards Ceremony* is held twice a year (*Terms 2 and 4*) to recognise students, who consistently apply themselves and are achieving to the best of their potential.

Our first awards ceremony was held on Wednesday 8th May, a wonderful opportunity to celebrate our students' successes with the school community.

NCCD Information



Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified - the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
