We have a number of staff changes and appointments for 2025. These are as follows:



SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS AND KEY DATES

Attendance Matters: In 2024, the school refined attendance procedures, and I have communicated regularly with families, that for students to achieve their potential the expectation is for students to attend at least 95% of the year and for families to communicate reasons for student absences. Research has shown that students who miss 2 days of school each month (which long-term equates to missing 4 weeks of school in a year), will be educationally at risk of not completing optimum learning.

Attendance is a team effort between the school and families. Please ensure you **communicate in a timely manner**, the reason for your child's absence, and contact the school should you require further support with your child's attendance. In addition, please be mindful of having your child arrive on time to school as partial absences also contribute to long term attendance concerns. Mobile Phone Policy: Mobile phones are banned from use in NSW Department schools, unless needed for medical reasons. There has been a noticeable increase in social interactions of students and learning concentration since the policy was implemented. Mobile phone pouches are issued to all students, including our new Year 7 on their first day at school. Please ensure your child has their phone in the pouch as they arrive at school. Staff are regularly positioned on the front gate to welcome students, and check their phones are in pouches. For our new families, please contact Mr White, the Deputy Principal, should you have further queries when school returns. Your support of this policy is appreciated.

Uniform: Kariong Mountains High School prides itself on being a uniform school. It is a requirement of students to wear the uniform appropriately and every day. A school uniform:

- Provides a platform for a student to feel included and have a sense of belonging with the school.
- ★ Provides safety for students as they are readily identifiable in the school setting.
- Economically supports parents and carers as additional clothing is not required through the week.



- Prepares students for expectations of employers for future pathways in respect to professional dress.
- Contributes to the development of our core value of Unity.

Hooded jumpers, except for the school hooded jumper and plain navy hooded jumpers with no logo, and tights/ leggings are **not** to be worn as part of the uniform. In addition, students are required to wear black leather or suede upper shoes, in line with the Department's WHS policy: *Thank you, to all families for your support in this area.*

Use of Bike racks: Due to the establishment of the new **support unit**, bike racks have been **relocated** to the front entry of the school. All students are to lock their bikes in this area at the beginning of the school day. Please ensure students bring locks for this purpose. **Bike security is the responsibility of students**.



Assessment Schedules Years 7-12: Assessment schedules will be published for all students. Year 12 received their schedules in Term 4 last year and Year 11 will be issued theirs at the upcoming information evening. Additionally, Years 7 - 10 schedules will be published by Week 4 at the latest. Assessment schedules can also be found on the school website.

Welcome to Term 1 at KMHS in 2025!

Welcome back to all students. I hope all families had a safe and happy break. As always, the new scholastic year is shaping up to be as busy as ever with quality learning and many other extra-curricula opportunities. Let's make this a positive year by setting goals and focussing on achieving these high expectations.

Organisational Reminders

We are a **uniform school** and this sits within our value of **Unity**. All students are expected to wear full school uniform every day. On rare occasions, where this is not possible, students need to see me before 8:50am to get a uniform pass. A note from home is also required. **Detentions will be issued to students who do not comply.**

Attendance is key to student achievement. When students are absent from school a notification from parents / carers is required on, or before, the day of return. This can be done via a note, email, phone call or Compass entry. If students are required to leave early for a legitimate purpose, please contact the office in the first instance. Arrangements can then be made to have your child ready to be collected and we can update our attendance records. Please check your Compass information to ensure all contact details are accurate. This is essential if we need to make contact with families, sometimes during emergency circumstances.

The **mobile phone ban in schools remains**. I continue to be impressed with the compliance and expect this will continue. *Teaching staff have commented on how much more engaged students have been in the classroom.*

Years 10/11 students have the opportunity to **change their elective subjects**. *These changes need to be made by the end of Week 4* (*February 21*). Assessment policy and schedule booklets will be issued to students in the near future.

Bike racks have shifted to the front entry of the school, due to the location of our new Support Unit. *It is strongly recommended that students lock their bikes*, as the school is not responsible if they are stolen.

Finally, we have **goal posts!** Their universal style caters for both Rugby League and Football (Soccer, to the uneducated). An opening ceremony in honour of a late student, Brody Morris, is being planned for the near future.

I am looking forward to another positive year at our fine school. With students embracing our values 'Unity, Knowledge Respect', great outcomes can be had by all.




